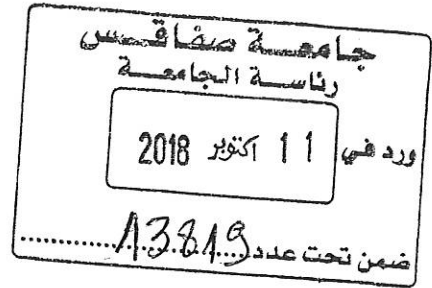

## Modules

The UCL Summer School offers over 60 modules from a wide range of subject areas. Many of our modules are introductory, meaning no prior subject knowledge is required, while others have specific entry requirements.

UCL recommends that each module is worth the equivalent of **4 US credits** or **7.5 ECTS**. Students can be guaranteed that each module carries the same academic rigor and workload as a regular UCL undergraduate module. Depending on the regulations at your home institution it may be possible to transfer credits gained to your own degree programme.

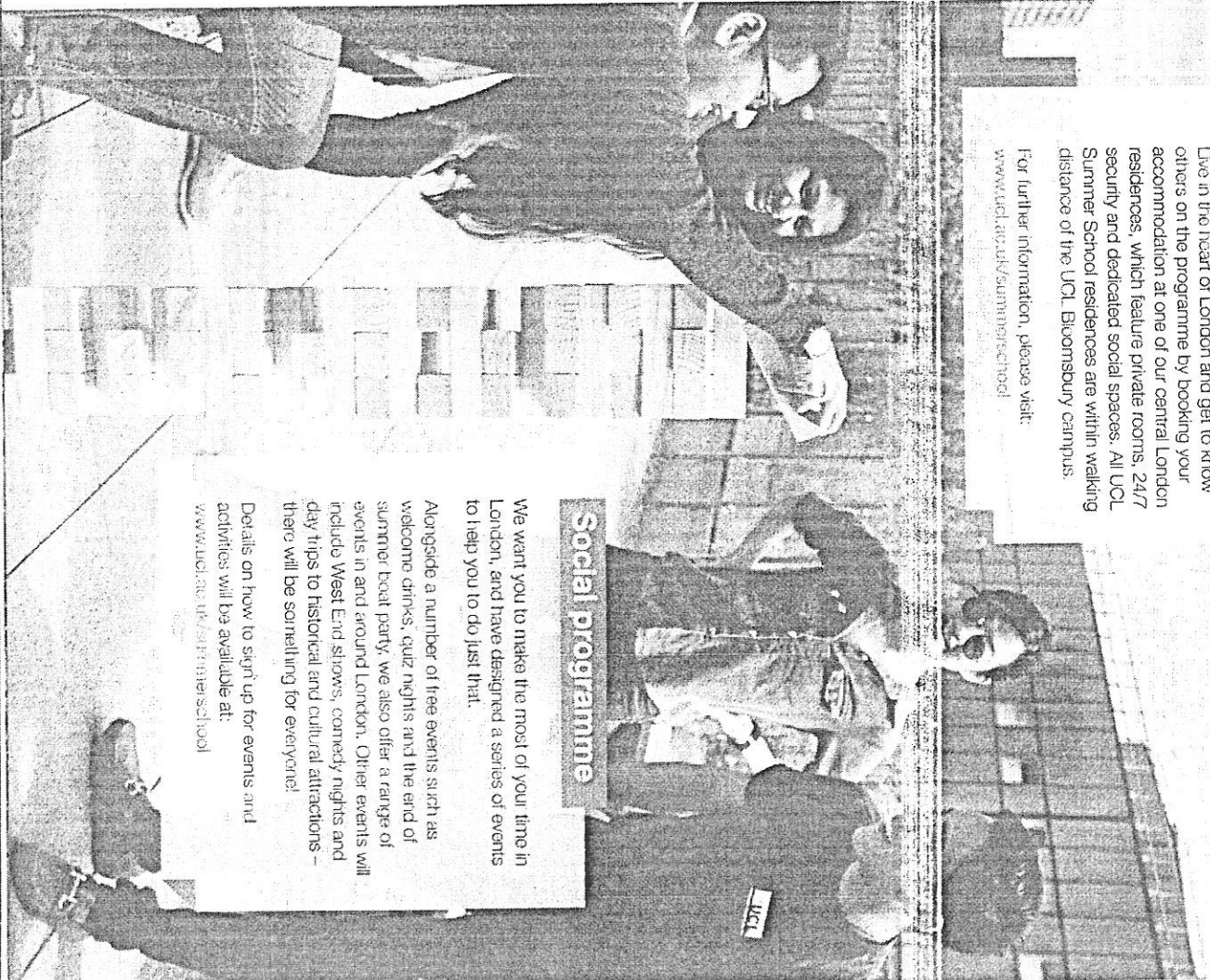

We want you to make the most of your time in London, and have designed a series of events to help you to do just that.

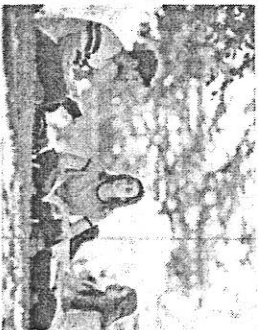
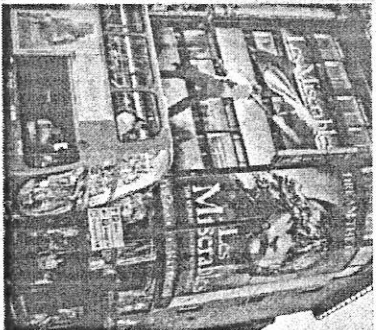

### About the UCL Summer School

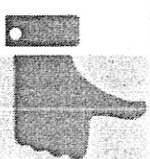
The UCL Summer School is divided into two sessions, each spanning three weeks (dates can be found on the back of this leaflet). You can choose to attend for one or two sessions, and you will study one module per session.

You will be taught by UCL academics in interactive groups and many modules incorporate class visits and guest speakers to further enhance your learning. As a UCL Summer School student, you will have full-time student status and a UCL ID card which entitles you to full borrowing rights in all of our libraries.

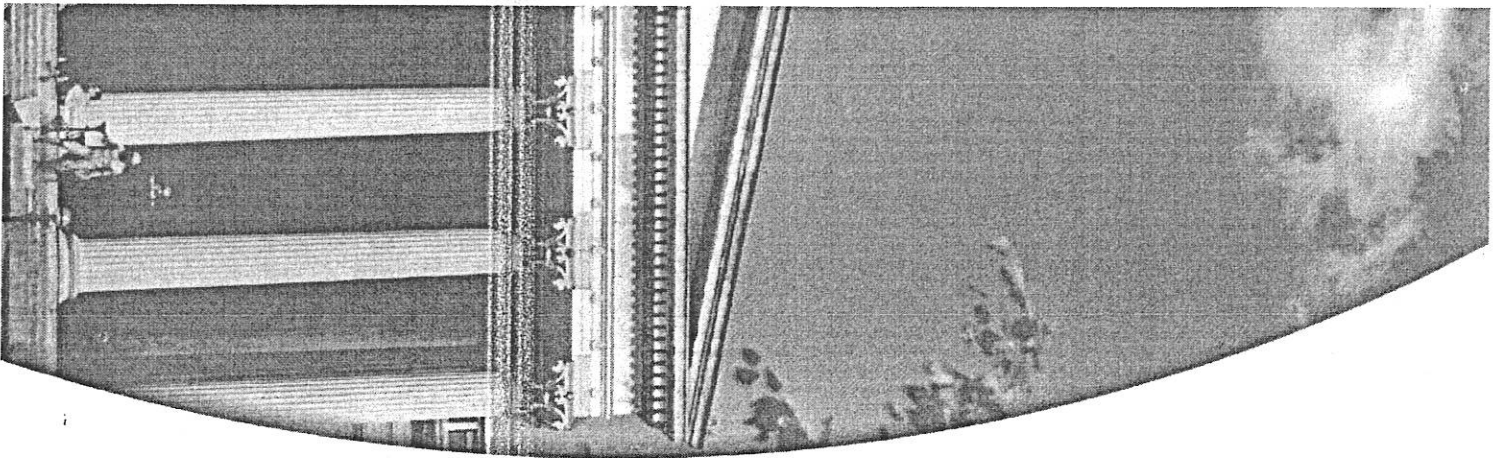
